

## An Explanation of GovEnergy 2012 Registration Rates

### Federal Attendee Registration Rates

\$495 - Online or Onsite

### Non-Federal Attendee Registration Rates

\$595 – Online; until 12 a.m. Friday August 10, 2012

\$795 – Onsite; beginning Saturday August 18, 2012

GovEnergy 2012 registration rates cover the following:

- 2.5 days of self-selected technical training led by policy, technology, and facility operations experts; attendees may choose from over 150 educational sessions
  - Each attendee is eligible to receive credit for a maximum of 12.5 technical training hours
  - Additional four-hour training sessions focusing on metering, behavior change, and how to do business with the federal government
